The Banquet is growing!

We are building support to expand to a 7 day a week free meal program by sharing our vision and mission in the community. We currently serve Tuesday and Thursday evenings as well as lunch on Saturdays.

It is our goal to start a fund drive shortly with the vision of relocating to a freestanding facility serving dinner Monday through Friday with a breakfast or lunch on Saturdays and Sundays. We anticipate once fully operational, the Banquet would be serving over 70,000 nutritious meals the first year.

To accomplish this ambitious goal is going to take the work of many volunteers as well as financial support from our community. In the upcoming months we will be solidifying plans for a freestanding Banquet facility. This facility will house The Banquet for an expanded meal program as well as provide resources and referrals to resources helping those in need. The Banquet is a faith-based ministry providing care for all. We are all about helping the hurting, hungry and lonely in our community! Everyone else is welcome to join us too!

To summarize, we will be a multi-generational, family-friendly ministry that feeds the body, mind and soul.

The Banquet has served over 191,500 meals to date. The average cost of a meal is about \$3.00 per person. Virtually our entire operating budget comes from private donations. Cash and material donations are relied on for supplies, equipment, staffing, and operating costs. All donations are tax deductible as provided by law.

The Banquet continues to look for regular volunteer coordinators for our various stations while serving our meals. Contact Karla if you are interested in helping.

Stephen Ministry

I need to hear what I'm think-



Have you ever noticed that a concern you've been tossing around in your mind becomes clearer when you actually <u>talk</u> about it? You still have to decide what to do about the concern, but a direction may be more obvious once you've

described the issue to someone else, especially if that someone restates the thoughts you expressed or asks questions to clarify what you said. Or – once you've heard your thoughts out loud, you may decide the situation is different from how you originally perceived it.

Perhaps family and friends are already familiar with your concern. Perhaps they even have ideas about what you should (or shouldn't) do, and while they may be encouraging and supportive, the best listener in this kind of situation may be someone outside your circle of family and friends – someone who hasn't heard the details of your concern before, and who may help you see the situation from a different angle. A Stephen Minister can be this type of listener. A Stephen Minister doesn't have a personal stake in any decision you make, and makes no judgments about the "best" way to deal with your concern. Your Stephen Minister wants to listen, support, and care for you so that, with God's help, you can work through whatever is weighing you down.

Could this kind of listener help you cope with your current concern? If so, talk to one of the pastors or to a Stephen Leader (Karen Botine, Margaret Fiechtner), about receiving care from one of Trinity's six Stephen Ministers. You can also fill out the green Confidential Care Request card in the pew rack and drop it in the Confidential Care box at the Welcome desk in the lobby.

Trust Fund Spotlight



Coordinating Our Efforts...

In 2017, the Trust Fund Committee approved 25 requests for funding – a total of \$76,442.13 invested in supporting the mission of Trinity in just one year. How do we know these funds are being used

where they are most needed? The procedures followed by the Trust Fund Committee help to assure this.

First, requests for funding (grant requests) may be submitted by any of the staff or by Boards and Committees of the congregation. Each grant request first goes to the church council for approval. When the Trust Fund Committee considers the request, the Committee already knows the request is aligned with the council's goals and priorities for Trinity.

Second, a member of the church council, usually the first vice president, serves as the council liaison to the Trust Fund Committee and attends the monthly Trust Fund meetings. Because of this relationship, the council is aware of what the Trust Fund Committee is doing, and the council liaison can give the Committee a "heads up" about grant requests that are being developed but haven't been finalized yet. Such a notice was given at the end of 2017 so, as was mentioned in the budget presentation at the annual meeting of the congregation, the Trust Fund Committee has set aside funds for several items (primarily affecting children and youth) for which we will receive formal requests in 2018.

If you would like additional information on how the Trust Fund Committee works, or on contributing to either the Trust Fund or the Endowment Fund, talk to a member of the Trust Fund Committee – Richard Bjornson, Karen Botine, Richard Hansen, Dwight Offerman, or Susan Weiand.

The Trust Fund report was not included in the Annual Report, but is available in the church office.
