Thoughts on Confirmation, by Pastor Paul & Trinity's Confirmands

So shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it. - Isaiah 55:11



As Lutherans we believe in the validity of baptizing infants and small children, because a core tenant of our theology is that God's love comes first. And so for us, we find beauty and power in the idea that God embraces us with love before we can even understand it or articulate what it means to love God back. Nevertheless, we also realize that at some point the faith that has been given needs to be embraced for it to really grow and bear fruit. And this is exactly why we have

confirmation. For Lutherans, confirmation is when young adults take ownership of the faith that has been given. Confirmation is a time for asking questions, digging deeper, and hopefully discovering that the journey of Christian faith adds hope and purpose to the journey of life. By the time you read this we will have confirmed 21 young people. Hallelujah! And as is our tradition, each of them will have written a faith statement about how they understand God and faith. But to be honest, every year before reading faith statements I am filled with a mixture of excitement and anxiety. The anxiety comes because I really want the kids to have grown in depth and appreciation of God and faith. And to be fair, I shouldn't doubt that they have, because they demonstrate their spiritual growth throughout the year. But there's always a doubter in me that worries that maybe our confirmation ministry didn't do the trick. The good news is that year after year God proves my doubting self wrong, (*Why did I ever doubt it?*), as I am filled with hope and wonder at the depth of their faith statements. And so I invite you to join me in being inspired by their thoughts on God and faith! Below are some excerpts:

- If Jesus is love, then he is present when you donate your time to help build houses in Africa... If Jesus is love, then he is present when a mother comforts a hurting child [...] I know love, compassion, and mercy. I have seen others do these things, and since Jesus is all of those things... I know Jesus.
- My faith deeply defines me as a person. I've learned that we are all part of a bigger picture as servants of God.
- For as long as I can remember I have been going to this church, and it has taught me that I see and hear God everywhere. I see him in smiling kids' faces in church and in the amazing activities we have here. I see him in friends that I have made within the congregation, at banquets and Lenten suppers.
- With God I plan to live generously, happily teaching and learning in God's way to give as much as God and others have given me.
- In the apparent infinity of our universe, it is hard to imagine that a little, human-shaped clump of a few octillion atoms could have any significance at all, but God tells me that I mean something, and nothing could mean more to me.

Stephen Ministry



Sometimes we hesitate to ask for help or to share our deepest feelings because we fear what others will think of us. Perhaps you have even been told "you shouldn't think that way" by someone who <u>meant</u> to be comforting or reassuring. You don't have to hear such messages very often to decide that it's best to keep your feelings to yourself, even if these feelings become increasingly heavy to carry inside you.

Your Stephen Minister will see you first as a fellow brother or sister in Christ who is struggling with a concern, a sorrow, or a frustration. He/she will accept that the feelings you express are a true representation of what's going on inside you right now, and will not "grade" them as good/bad, appropriate/ inappropriate, or on any other scale. Your Stephen Minister will see you as someone who needs Christian care and support, and will be prepared to listen as you express your feelings and work through them out loud. It's likely that you will find this response from your Stephen Minister helps to lighten the load you are carrying.

Is concern about what others will think keeping you from asking for a Stephen Minister's help? If so, talk to one of the pastors or to a Stephen Leader (Karen Botine, Margaret Fiechtner), about what happens during a Stephen Minister's care, and about receiving care from one of Trinity's Stephen Ministers. You can also fill out the green Confidential Care Request card in the pew rack and drop it in the Confidential Care box at the Welcome Center in the lobby.

Let's Go Camping!

Mission trips, the ELCA Youth Gathering, and Bible Camp are important faith formation experiences for many young people. We are fortunate to have a

Bible Camp, the Camp of the Cross, close enough to Bismarck for many of our children and youth to participate. It's true, however, that costs for camping have risen, and may be just a little more than some families can handle. Because of Trinity's Trust Fund we are able to address this issue.

At their March meeting, the Trust Fund Committee approved a grant of \$3,000 to the campership fund that is already part of Trinity's budget. This will enable Trinity to increase the value of the camping scholarships (or camperships) that are available for those children and youth who would like to have the Biblecamping experience this summer. This grant was made possible by income the Trust Fund earns from invested gifts and bequests received over the past 30+ years. Because all gifts are permanently invested and only the income from those investments is spent, the March grant may include income from a gift that was given even before the 2018 campers were born!

Perhaps you had faith formation or faith-growing experiences that you would like to make available to others. Your gift or bequest to the Trust Fund, or your gift to the ND Tax Credit Endowment Fund, can provide income that could be used for future faith-building opportunities for many different age groups.
