Western ND Youth Gathering



Coping with Change...

Are there actions in your life that you always do the same way? It may be something as simple as always putting the car keys in one specific location, so you don't even have to think about where they are when you are in a hurry to leave

the house. What happens when someone moves those keys and you can't find them? It can get your whole day off to a bad start.

This is what happens when something changes in our lives. It may be a change we have been looking forward to (perhaps a promotion at work) or one we have been dreading (such as physical aging). In either case, the change may require us to make other changes -- how we begin each day, the decisions we make during the day, how we relate to others, and so on.

Perhaps you have always been skilled at making those adjustments, but sometimes the process doesn't go smoothly. We may resent the fact that change is necessary; we may have difficulty identifying appropriate ways to adjust, or may just need to express feelings about the whole change process. Do any of these situations describe where you are right now? Perhaps sharing your current feelings or challenges with a Stephen Minister could be helpful to you.

Even the good things in life can require change, and change is often easier when we don't walk alone. If you would like to have a Stephen Minister walk with you for a while, talk to one of the pastors or to a Stephen Leader (Karen Botine, Margaret Fiechtner). You can also fill out the green Confidential Care Request card in the pew rack and drop it in the Confidential Care box at the Welcome desk in the lobby.

Trust Fund Spotlight

Avoid the Last-Minute Rush...

Was December a busy time for you last year? If it wasn't, you are probably in the minority. If it was, eliminate one thing from this year's December to-

do list to give yourself a little break. Make your gift to Trinity's North Dakota Tax Credit Endowment Fund (the Endowment Fund) this month or in November. If you give now, your gift will begin to earn income sooner, you will have one less thing to remember in December, and you will avoid the end-of-the-year busy time in the church office.

Just to remind you...

The minimum gift is \$5,000 given within one calendar year to any one entity (such as Trinity's Endowment Fund) and the maximum is \$25,000 (or \$50,000 for a married couple). The total gift may be given at one time during the year, or as several smaller gifts that total at least \$5,000.

The tax credit is 40% of the charitable deduction allowed by the IRS, up to a maximum of \$10,000 per year per taxpayer (so the net cost to you will be less than the amount of your gift).

The credit can be carried forward up to 3 years if it cannot be used completely in one tax year.

To make a gift to the Endowment Fund, pick up a copy of the Gift Agreement forms in the church office. A copy of the forms will be returned to you for your tax records after they have been signed by a member of the Trust Fund Committee. If you make several gifts to the Endowment Fund during the year, complete a separate Gift Agreement for each gift.

All gifts to Trinity's ND Tax Credit Endowment Fund must be given without restrictions. If you wish to restrict your gift to a specific purpose, it may be given to the Trust Fund, but it will not qualify for the ND Tax Credit.
