Stephen Ministry

Have you kicked yourself recently?

The apostle Paul said it for all of us: For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. (Romans 7:19, ESV) Most of us are pretty good at kicking ourselves when we recognize our failures -- when we have done something wrong or when we failed to do the right thing. Probably all of us have had these "woulda, coulda, shoulda" discussions with ourselves at some time. The Bible even reminds us that "...all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God"... (Romans 3:23, ESV). Yes, we are sinners, but the very next verse (Romans 3:24) assures us that we are also "... justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus..." One of my personal reminders of this gift is a little sign that says Grace is when God gives us what we don't deserve. Mercy is when God doesn't give us what we do deserve.

If you need more convincing that you are not a lost cause, the concordance of my favorite Bible lists 64 verses related to "grace", 43 verses on "mercy", and another 16 verses on "merciful". Exploring some of these verses alone or with a Stephen Minister can be comforting or reassuring, and discussing what you have read with another person of faith can be a faith-strengthening experience for both of you.

Would you benefit from meeting with someone who can help you see past your sins to the grace and mercy of God? If so, consider asking to be matched with a Stephen Minister. Contact one of the Stephen Leaders (Karen Botine, Margaret Fiechtner).

Council update

At the March council meeting we received the first draft of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). This document will represent Trinity to senior pastor candidates. The MSP workgroup held two very productive focus group meetings. Our thanks to all who participated. Out of those focus groups came a number of comments that have helped us identify what the congregation feels is important.

A worship and music workgroup has been established to identify how we can continue to provide meaningful services that appeal to a broad range of members and potential members.

We have also established a personnel policy workgroup to review our existing policy. The goal is to make any necessary updates before a new senior pastor is called.

Trust Fund Spotlight Continuing the tradition...

Grants from the Trust Fund vary because the need for financial support of special activities and projects within Trinity varies from year to

year, and also because opportunities for outreach into the Bismarck-Mandan community – and the world – change over time. However, one type of grant has remained constant since 1992 – the Trinity scholarship. Sixteen scholarships were awarded for the 2018-2019 school year.

Yes, it's time once again for those young Trinity members heading to post-secondary education (2-year and 4-year colleges, vocational schools) to apply for Trinity scholarships. Completed applications were due in the church office by March 30. Just a couple of reminders to potential applicants:

- Read the directions carefully and make sure you have submitted everything that is required.
- Double-check with anyone from whom you've requested information (transcript, recommendation) to make sure the information has been sent.

Several past applicants missed the opportunity to be considered for a scholarship because their applications were incomplete.

Scholarship applications are usually considered at the April meeting of the Trust Fund Committee, and applicants are notified of scholarship approval or denial, and the amount of the scholarship in May.

Additionally, all of the financial data for the Trust Fund was not yet ready at the time of the Annual meeting. This information is now available and can be accessed at the Church Office.
