

## What kind of person can benefit from the care of a Stephen Minister?

Someone who is "running on empty". Are you the person that family, friends, and even coworkers turn to when they need to talk about the challenges and concerns in their lives? Are you always on the listening end of these conversations, but find that others are seldom interested in hearing your concerns? Do others seem to think your life runs smoothly and you don't have worries? Do you find yourself sinking under the weight of the problems others have shared with you, and grieving that you can't give them more help? If so, you may need to recharge your physical, emotional, or spiritual batteries.

Sometimes the person others identify as a "caregiver" needs the opportunity to unload some of the weight he or she is carrying. Even the perennial caregiver can benefit from being a care recipient for a time, because everyone's life has challenges. A relationship with a Stephen Minister can give this caregiver the opportunity to talk about his or her concerns. The opportunity to receive care, even for a short time, may be just what this care-giving person needs to lighten the load, so that he or she can return to providing a listening ear and care to others.

Are you the unofficial caregiver among those you know? Do you need time apart from giving care, and a relationship with someone who listens to <u>your</u> concerns?

### **Trust Fund Spotlight**



Some of the biggest disagreements among family members seem to arise over who gets which possessions after a loved one dies. Often those disagreements focus on the simplest items, such as the cracked turkey platter that is no longer usable, but which occupied the center of the table for every Thanksgiving meal that anyone can remember.

Perhaps you don't need to make a decision about a turkey platter, but do you have plans for the distribution of your estate? If your plans include a bequest to Trinity, where do you want that bequest to go? If your intent is that the bequest be permanently invested in the Trust Fund where only the investment income is spent, the language in your will, insurance policy, or other part of your estate plan must state that Trinity's <u>Trust Fund</u> is to be the recipient. If the language states that the bequest is to "Trinity", it will not automatically go to the Trust Fund. It may be used for other worthy purposes, as determined by the church Council. If your intent is that the principal of the bequest be spent, rather than permanently invested, this should also be stated. This type of bequest will be placed in a dedicated account and used for the purposes you specified.

Estate planning can be a way to express what is important to you, and can also be a gift of love to your family. Make certain your wishes are carried out by (1) putting your wishes in writing, and (2) discussing your plans with your family and with those who will be responsible for carrying out your wishes.
