A Song of Thanksgiving

Several years ago, *Gather*, the magazine for the women of the ELCA featured a Bible Study centered under the theme "*In Good Company: Stories of Biblical Women*". One issue was dedicated to Deborah, a judge in the early days of Israel, who was persuaded by Barak to lead 10,000 soldiers into battle. I marveled at her determination and vision.

In their earliest days the tribes of Israel were scattered and fragmented. They were not yet a single people, a single nation. But Deborah was a dynamic prophetess and a judge over the tribes of Israel. Unity, loyalty, and community increased under her charismatic leadership.

Deborah sang a song of thanks to the leaders of the people who had caught the vision of being Yahweh's people and to the people themselves for their faithfulness. A nation was being born.

Believing in the potential and ability of the people around you- as Deborah did- is like blowing air on the coals of a fire. It is one life feeding and being fed by another life; it is infectious and animating. Others know you believe in them by the confidence that is placed in them, the responsibility committed to their care, and the respect accorded their insight and instruction. Believing in others creates a community of co-equals. It makes the scattering of humanity into a gathering of community.

The church is a gathered people. We are the bony structures, sturdy muscles, and throbbing heart of a God still active in this world. We need each other. We *are* each other. And we are more than just we ourselves because of each other.

Thank you to everyone for being there for me in my short time here at Trinity. This Thanksgiving my daughter Mikaela and I are thankful for all of your care and connectedness. I have and continue to be thankful for your gracious welcome and helpfulness. You are a gifted and compassionate community of faith.

The exercise of living one's life is often the act of blowing a gentle breath of life across the vision and talent found in those around us. It is to inspire unity of faith and commonness of purpose. It is to walk faithfully with God alongside one another. It is to sit at table with one another, offering prayers and thanksgivings for the One who is "Yahweh" and who is among us "Emmanuel".

Adopt-a Block

The Adopt-a-Block Food Distribution Truck is doing well. We now are picking up from both Cash Wise stores at least twice each week, once each week at all 5 Dan's stores and Einstein Bagels and sporadically at Natural Grocers and Master Bakery.

On Wednesday, Oct. 9th we collaborated with Great Plains Food Bank for a "Pop-Up" effort during our Jeannette Myhre School serve. In addition to the product we collected from grocery stores, Great Plains brought in 6 pallets of product for us to distribute. That evening, in the wind, rain and snow we served a record 99 households. Extra product from that evening has also been coming to The Banquet for use internally and for distribution to our guests.

Numbers Served as of Oct. 9:

Households: 645

Adults: 1,003

Seniors Age 60 & up: 166

Children 17 & under: 1,063

If food pickups continue at the present rate Adopt-a-Block will have distributed well over 20,000 and perhaps closer to 30,000 pounds in product during the month of October. The money saved on this product is going directly to the bottom line of grocery bills.

Adopt-a-Block Ribbon Cutting

The Sept. 21 ribbon cutting at South Central High School was well received. The Bismarck/Mandan Chamber was on hand as was Great Plains Food Bank. Great Plains President Melissa Sobolic called the Adopt-a-Block Food Distribution Truck "groundbreaking" and the first of its kind in North Dakota.

Stephen Ministry

Can Stephen Ministry help my friend or relative?

Occasionally, someone will tell a Stephen Leader that they know a person (a friend or relative) who is going through a tough time. The teller feels this person might benefit from having a Stephen Minister. How fortunate the hurting person is to have someone in his/her life who is aware of a need and who also knows about a possible source of support and comfort! There's just one catch...

The hurting person must \underline{want} the help that is available. This means (1) the hurting person must ask for help, or, (2) the hurting person must agree to have the friend or relative refer him/her to Stephen Ministry. (Often this second choice is the most comfortable for the hurting person because many of us are reluctant to ask directly for help.) Stephen Leaders will not approach the hurting person with an offer of a Stephen Minister unless they are sure there is interest in such an offer.

If you are the concerned friend or relative, encourage the hurting person to request a Stephen Minister. If this person is interested, but reluctant to take the step of asking for help, ask your friend/relative, "Would you be willing to have me refer you to the Stephen Leaders?" If your friend/relative agrees, you can then contact a Stephen Leader and make a formal referral. A Stephen Leader will then make an appointment to explain Stephen Ministry more fully to the hurting person and assess whether this type of support and comfort is appropriate for the person.

What can you do for your friend or relative who is hurting? You can give support, encouragement, and comfort, often just by being a good listener. You can also take the steps described above to connect this person to Stephen Ministry for additional Christian support and comfort. Trust Fund Spotlight

Who Knew???

When the Trust Fund was established by Trinity in 1987, hopes were high that having this fund would encourage Trinity's members to invest in future faith-building opportunities that no one could see at the time the gift was given. Early disbursements of income were to radio broadcasts (from the restricted Jasman gift) and the first scholarship in 1992. In the past 30 years income from the Trust Fund and the Endowment Fund (established in 2014) have grown to where the Trust Fund Committee can consider support for projects and activities totaling more than \$70,000 per year.

One of the projects this year will be to continue to provide internship stipends to encourage high school musicians to sing in the annual *Messiah* performance. This is an important event in Bismarck-Mandan, but many of the faithful singers are growing older and may not have many "singing years" left. We hope encouraging young singers to become part of this 90-year tradition will build the next generation of singers who return year after year for this beautiful and meaningful start to the Christmas season.

What projects or activities will be introduced in the future? We don't know, but with income from the Trust Fund and Endowment Fund, Trinity will be in a position to provide support that will help us WELCOME, EQUIP, and SEND. So, in this month of Thanksgiving, consider giving a gift to allow this worthy effort to continue.
