Record breaking year!

The Banquet had a record braking year! We served 37,165 guests, 7,931 take out boxes and had 2,704 volunteers. Many thanks to all of the sponsors and volunteers who keep the Banquet growing.

Adopt-A-Block



Adopt-A-Block food distribution continues to do well. During the months of October through December, over 70,000 pounds of grocery products were distributed through the truck.

Numbers served from June 19th through December 31st:

Households: 893 Adults: 1,407

Seniors age 60 and up: 234 Children 17 and under: 1,362

Some of the people counted above came just once, while others came sporadically each week. If we multiply the number of people in each household by the number of times they have visited the truck, we come up with a total of 10,941 served since the June 19th launch of Adopt-A-Block.

What difference will it make?

Whatever happens in your life -- good, bad, or somewhere in-between -- will affect you in some way. You were half of a couple -- and now you're not; your value was defined by the work you did or the title you held, and the work or title no longer applies; an injury means you can't do some-

thing you once enjoyed; you looked forward to a less hectic life, but now you're looking for a reason to get up in the morning.

Life doesn't have a "reverse" button, so change means you are challenged to:

- Acknowledge what happened and how it affects you;
- Accept that you are not the same "you" that you were before;
- Begin learning how to be a "you" that is different in some way.

It can be helpful to discuss these challenges with someone. This is where a Stephen Minister might enter the picture. Your Stephen Minister can listen, ask questions, re-state what you said (but in different words). Hearing your thoughts come out of someone else's mouth might help you clarify what you are thinking. You are still in charge of deciding your next steps, but your Stephen Minister can be part of your support system as you work through the process. Even the good things in life can require change, and change is often easier when we don't walk alone

Are you at a point in your life where some Christian support and encouragement would be helpful in exploring where you are going after a change in your life circumstances? If so, contact one of the Stephen Leaders (Margaret Fiechtner, Karen Botine), or fill out the green Confidential Care Request card in the pew rack. If you know someone who is going through this type of situation, encourage them to consider a Stephen Minister's support.

The month of December had income of \$92,017.23 and expenses of \$57,258.90. Trinity ended 2019 with \$47,444.74 surplus income over expenses. The \$47,444.74 was transferred to Trinity's Contingency/Savings account in order to start 2020 fiscal year with new revenue and expenses.

Trust Fund Spotlight



What's so good about a Trust Fund?

As specified in the Bylaws, both the Trust Fund and the North Dakota Tax Credit Endowment Fund exist to enhance the work of Trinity by establishing new ministries and stewardship opportunities additional to and apart from the general operation of the congregation.

Providing for the ongoing operation of Trinity, as reflected in the annual budget, is the responsibility of the current members and is met through the weekly, monthly or annual pledges and offerings. The income from the Trust and Endowment Funds enables Trinity to extend our reach <u>beyond</u> the limits of the annual budget, and perhaps go in directions we didn't know about in the past, or take on new projects that once existed only in dreams. It has also enabled us to address unexpected and unbudgeted situations quickly (remember the cost of snow removal a couple of winters ago?).

In 2019, almost \$43,000 was distributed in grants. Approximately one-third of that amount was used for college scholarships. As we move forward, what will be needed to support the growth in faith of our youth? the young adults? the growing families? the empty-nesters? the seniors? How will we reach out to those who are searching for something to give meaning to their lives? How can we link with other ministries to reach farther or make an even greater difference in the world around us? You can answer those questions, and the Trust and Endowment Funds can help.
