Greetings in Christ's name!

It is a different kind of Holy Week that we enter into this year. We did not get to gather in the sanctuary to wave palm branches while joyfully singing "All Glory Laud and Honor." We will not gather in the sanctuary on Maundy Thursday to hear the story of Jesus washing disciple's feet, an act of servanthood by the savior. We will not have the opportunity to gather together in the sanctuary to hear the passion story of Jesus arrest, trial and death. We will not gather face-to-face on Easter Sunday for the traditional triumphal services. It is a different kind of Holy Week.

Yet, it is still Holy Week. Easter is coming. We will still worship. Thanks be to God for Trinity's decades long radio ministry – which means we can still worship, even if it is not face-to-face. Thanks be to God for the gift of new technology which is allowing us to "Live Stream" our worship services now thanks to the estate of Alice Marks. Worship will be different but we will still worship the One who overcame sin, death and darkness when he arose Easter morning.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, I pray that during this very unusual Holy Week you will find new ways that the passion story connects to your everyday life. I pray that this story would take root in your very being, helping you to see that the resurrection gift is a gift for the whole world, which includes you. You are a beloved one of the Savior.

Here are some Family Faith Questions to engage with others during this Holy Week. If you are home alone consider calling one of your church family members to ponder these questions together.

-What has been the most difficult aspect of "social distancing" and the associated disruptions to daily life?
-Can you recall a time when new life came from what felt like an experience of death? *(for example, the loss of a job that lead to a better opportunity)*-Who or what is often on your mind?
-What are you praying for these days?

-When life "returns to normal" what is something you will do?

One day we will be able to worship together again, face-to-face. I look forward to that day. Until then we remember that Christ is our Hope. Together we will come through this and we will give thanks to God!

In the meantime, I give thanks to God for your faithfulness. Members of this congregation continue to financially support the ministry. That means people are being fed. (Did you see Jan and the Trinity Food Pantry on the news?) Your faithful support means staff are available to lead worship services. It means we have been able to partner with congregations who don't have the technology Trinity does. It means we have been able to talk and pray with members in need, and provide resources for faith building in the home. Trinity has a strong ministry and it will continue because of you.
