For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Jeremiah 29:11

I have always been a planner. I come by it naturally. Working in television news for almost 15 years there was always a hard deadline – the newscast did not wait for you if you were not ready. I was blessed by a call to a wonderful four-point parish but to keep up with the multiple worship services, various boards and committees took lots of planning. My years of work in the synod office meant lots of planning. Organizing events like synod assembly or educational opportunities meant lots of time in front of a white board drawing plans.

We are living in a time of incredible change brought on by an unseen force, a tiny virus. This virus has forced us to reconfigure everything we do. Our lives are totally different. Most people shop differently, live differently (how many more times a day are you washing your hands compared to several months ago.) Most of us are limiting our trips out into public. Life has changed.

Our worship life has changed. Our faith lives have changed. Now the question is, "How do we plan for the future? For an unknowable future?" We do not know what the future holds. Will the virus subside? How soon will a vaccine be released? Will this threat go away? In the midst of all of the questions this is a certain – our future involves God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ who by the power of the Holy Spirit continues to be with us.

The prophet Jeremiah speaks of God having a plan for a future of hope. Our hope is grounded in the death and resurrection of Jesus. No matter what happens to us we are safe in God's hands for Jesus sake. In your baptism you were connected to the Risen One.

With that promise in hand we make plans for the future. Actually, we are making multiple plans so that ministry in Jesus name will continue through Trinity Lutheran regardless of what happens with this virus. There is work to do in Jesus name. We have been called to do it. May we have the vision to see where God's plan is leading.

In Person Worship Returns in June

Come worship with Trinity, outdoors beginning Wednesday, June 3th. Worship will happen in the "Peace Chapel" area on the East side of our building. In making the decision council accepted the following recommendations from Trinity's Safe Opening Task Force:

- That this summer (June-August) Trinity provide face to face worship on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings outdoors at the Peace Chapel. (only outside.)
- Have Everybody bring their own chairs or blankets.
- Have Staff provide some sort of marking of the area showing 36 square foot spaces.
- No sharing of the Peace No shaking hands with Greeters No Offering Plates passed.
- Encourage people to wear masks in accordance with CDC guidelines understanding that some people can't wear a mask, there will be no shaming of those who don't.
- Sunday morning 8:30 worship continues for the sake of Radio and Live Streaming but continues to be a "closed service" with only those present who are needed for the sake of broadcasting/streaming the service.
- Even in inclement weather services will be outside only.
- Restrooms will be available inside the church but access within the church will be restricted.
- Prior to Face to Face worship we use all communication resources available to us to teach safe distancing as well as, the How's and Why's of what we will and will not be doing at worship.
- Prior to Face to Face worship we will need to train all worship teams such as greeters/ushers. The first two weeks of outdoor worship we do not do communion – just to get used to this new routine of worship. When we do begin communion at first it will be through the sharing of the bread/body of Christ only (communion in one kind.)
- That the HVAC System is assessed, especially in the sanctuary to ensure that fresh air is being introduced at safe levels.

The Safe Opening Task Force spent significant time talking about safety protocols for indoor worship. We will wait until later this summer to share those recommendations.

Worshipping Safely...

It would be tragic if our worship services became a place where COVID-19 was spread. With that in mind here are reminders to keep you safe.

-If you do not feel comfortable being in public that is alright. Staying home is a fine option. We will continue to provide the 8:30 worship service on 1270AM as well as Facebook Live Stream. You do not need to feel guilty if you choose to worship from home.

-If you are sick stay home, that is a powerful way to love your neighbor.

-If you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for the virus in the 14 day please stay home.

If you do come and worship, please:

-Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds with soap. It is the best way to stop the spread of the virus. If that is not possible use hand sanitizer.

-Don't touch your face.

-Wearing a mast protects your neighbor, not you. Be a good neighbor and wear a mask for the sake of others.

-If you touch your mask, you contaminate your hands, so wash them or use hand sanitizer.

-Keep 6 feet apart.

Even with not being able to serve hot meals and share in the community The Banquet offers, great things are still happening at The Banquet!

Average number of to-go meals served each week in April: 650

Adopt-a-Block Grocery Distribution continues to go well. Our expansion to serving 6 days a week has boosted serving numbers to 300-400 households per week. Since October 1, Adopt-a-Block has distributed over 200,000 pounds of food and served over 1,700 individual households including about 6,000 people! Some come every week, some when they need a little help and some households have only come once.

Adopt-a-Block has purchased a walk-in freezer that is being set up at River of Hope in northeast Bismarck. Karla/The Banquet can store frozen product in the walk-in. Doing so will allow Karla to take advantage of free meat product from Great Plains Food Bank or perhaps other entities who may wish to donate frozen product to The Banquet.

Even though things are in a holding pattern, The Banquet is feeding lots of people and doing our part to get through the coronavirus pandemic.

How often do you use your face to communicate your thoughts or feelings without using words? What happens to that non-verbal message when half of your face is covered by a mask? In a term borrowed from the fashion industry – you can still *smize*, or smile with your eyes.

You can shape your mouth into a smile even when you don't feel "smiley", but it seems that a smize has to come from inside you, from positive thoughts or feelings. What can you rejoice about during a stressful time? Look for the little things – having windows open, the sound of geese flying overhead in the early morning, the joy of seeing faces other than the ones that share your house, the convenience of shopping hours just for your age group, discovering that there is still a choice at the meat counter (even if it's more limited than usual). When your mind and your heart have found things to rejoice about, your feelings will sparkle in your eyes, and you can smize at the people you encounter. That smize might be the best thing that happens to them today, too.

But if life is weighing a little heavily on you right now, consider whether it would be helpful to talk with someone about your feelings, a family member, a trusted friend, or a Stephen Minister. Yes, we are all experiencing the same events, but each of us may be affected differently.
