

Congregational Update for June 5, 2020

Greetings in Christ's name!

A pastor friend of mine who leads congregational renewal workshops, always uses the phrase, "Relationship. Relationship. Relationship. It is all about relationship. Relationship with God. Relationship with one another. Relationship with our neighbor." Paul says this as well in his letter to the Galatians.

"...for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus."

Galatians 3:26-28

The Congregational Relationships Coordinator will be responsible for helping build a culture of care for one another within our congregation. This will be accomplished through Small Group or Affinity Group ministries. The person will need to be able to use electronic platforms to help make this possible.
