Advent—2020

For the past several years, Sirius XM dedicates a few channels to playing Christmas music to get us in the mood for the season. This year, the programming began on November 5th, so true to form, I tuned my car radio to Sirius XM channel 73, which is called "Holiday Traditions." The focus of this channel is Christmas music from the 40's through the 70's which is my speed. There are great tunes from the swing era and big bands, Ella Fitzgerald, Bing Crosby and "White Christmas" and songs from the movie "Holiday Inn", plus all the Motown greats with the Supremes and Christmas songs from the Carpenters. Sirius XM also offers more contemporary options like "Holly" but I just can't listen to Madonna's version of "Santa Baby" anymore...but that's just me.

So far, listening to these songs has not put me into the Christmas mood yet...I wonder why? Take the 1963 song "It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year", recorded by Andy Williams. My folks had the "The Andy Williams Christmas Album" which included that song, and that album got played over and over again at our house growing up. Here's part of the lyric -

It's the most wonderful time of the year

The song has kind of lost its magic this year...it just makes me sad about the present reality and the reality of "Christmas past". Another song playing just this morning as I drove into work was "Whatever Happened to Christmas?", recorded in 1968 by Frank Sinatra from the album "The Sinatra Family Wish You a Merry Christmas" which we also played at home growing up. This song certainly takes on new meaning this year...

Whatever happened to Christmas? It's gone and left no traces,
Whatever happened to the faces or the glow,
Whatever happened to Christmas, to the Christmas way of living?
Whatever happened to the giving, the magic in the snow?

Remember the sights and the smells and the sounds, and remember cheery calls, Remember how love was all around, whatever happened to it all?

Whatever happened to Christmas, bells in the streets were ringing, Whatever happened to the singing, the songs we used to know.

Whatever happened to this Christmas, and when it disappeared from view.

This year, maybe more than ever, we need to remember that Christmas is in our heart...Christ comes to us "Emmanuel"...to be with us forever. We may not be able to 'sing' those lovely carols together in church...but I plan to sing out in the shower! Christ will be there in the manger...for you and for me. The darkness of this present time has no power over the 'Light coming into the world.' Be safe and warm everyone...toast some marshmallows anyway...and remember that we are never left alone in darkness...it really is the 'most wonderful time of the year!"

Six Weeks on Money

Do your personal finances keep you up at night? Does talking about money make you cringe? Trinity Lutheran is participating in an ELCA pilot program on personal finance called "Six Weeks on Money." This is a sixweek program that focuses on viewing money management and personal finance in a positive, faith-driven way. It is:

BIBLICAL: What Jesus says about money and God's abundance

ACCESSIBLE: For all incomes, backgrounds, and situations. **FLEXIBLE:** Non-judgmental and realistic approach to credit cards and home mortgages.

HOLISTIC: Neither "pro" or "anti" wealth. Focus on a healthy relationship with money by helping people align with core values.

This is an all-digital course with opportunities for several small discussion groups. The program will start on or around January 25th. Trinity is offering this program to families at a discounted rate with the understanding of participants providing feedback on the course experience. The Banquet will be relocating to the new Dream Center Bismarck being built at 1805 Park Avenue. As part of the relocation, The Banquet will be responsible for construction and furnishing of the commercial kitchen. Estimated cost of the kitchen is about \$500,000, including the build-out itself, vent hoods/ducting, grease trap, appliances and fire suppression system.

I miss you...

How many times have you heard this from someone you used to see on a regular basis? I experience this every Sunday morning when I sit on my perch in the choir loft and look at the empty pew where you used to sit during the 8:30 service. I know there are good reasons why you aren't there. I may have heard that you are OK, and I am grateful you are taking care of yourself, but I do miss seeing you. And then... I get a phone call from someone who says "I heard you read the Scripture this morning" and I know that we shared worship.

When I was a teenager, I heard a pastor speak about being a prisoner of war and sharing what we would now call "virtual" Holy Communion with other prisoners. The prisoners could not see each other, and they had neither bread nor wine to distribute, but they had memories. As one of them recited the Words of Institution they all paused to remember past occasions when the bread was placed in their hands and they sipped the wine from a common cup. They remembered the people with whom they had shared this experience, and gave thanks that even without the physical elements they had been reminded of the gift of life they had all received.

This pastor and his fellow prisoners saw an opportunity for sharing and strengthening their faith where others might have seen nothing. And that reminds me how fortunate we are to have multiple ways to share God's Word and strengthen our faith, and to be part of the same community of believers, even as we "social distance".
