Trinity's Annual meeting is set for February 28 immediately following the 10:30 worship service. A couple of very important items of business will come before this meeting including:

- voting on updating our constitution, bylaws and continuing resolutions.

- voting on significant renovations and repairs to the sanctuary heating and cooling systems, the thermostatic controls for the building, windows for the 1950's educational addition, roof repairs, some light fixture replacements and a couple of other items.

To help members of the congregation understand both of these significant items, informational meetings will be held after the 8:30 worship on Sundays and the 6:00 worship on Wednesdays beginning January 24th. These meetings will be used to explain what is going on, to gather your questions and help members be prepared for the annual meeting.

As we approach the annual meeting it is important to understand who is a voting member of the congregation. This is the language from our current constitution:

- b. Confirmed members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.
 - c. Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members shall have communed and made a contribution of record during the current or preceding year.

This month we will publish a list of voting members. You are welcome to stop in the church office to ensure your name is on the list. We know that we have people who are members who contribute cash. To fulfill the "made a contribution of record" all a person needs to do is once a year put their cash in an envelope with their name on the outside of the envelope.

This is an all-digital course with opportunities for several small discussion groups. The program will start on January 25th. Trinity is offering this program to families at a discounted rate with the understanding of participants providing feedback on the course experience. Stephen Ministry



Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter are probably the most family-focused events of the year for most of us. We plan to travel "back home" or to welcome travelers into our homes, to put the extra leaves into the dining room table and set up the card tables for the kids, to prepare and eat the special foods that are only served at major family events, and to be totally exhausted when it's all over. But 2020 has been different, and it appears that much of 2021 will be the same. So... how is this "difference" affecting you? Are you the same person you were a year ago?

One of the things Stephen Ministers learn is that God can and does work change through the relationship with a care receiver, but they may be surprised to discover that change is not limited to the care receiver. The Stephen Minister may also experience change. During supervision sessions, Stephen Ministers are asked to reflect on what they are experiencing in their own lives as they give care to someone else. Some of the questions they consider could apply to each of us during the challenges of COVID-19. For example...

- How are you stretching, growing, or changing because of the changes you have had to make in your life this year?
- What insights are you gaining about yourself, about those closest to you, or about others in general because of the way you live or interact with others now?
- What kinds of caring relationships have you experienced this year and how are these caring relationships affecting you?
- In what ways has your relationship with God been challenged or changed because of current circumstances?

In his book, <u>You'll Get Through This</u>, Max Lucado reminds the reader, *"It won't be painless. It won't be quick. But God will use this mess for good."* What good may come out of our current experience? Will we be the same or different because of the experience? How is God working in each of us through this time?

Trust Fund Spotlight



When the Trust Fund was established in 1987, its stated purpose was to enhance the work of the Church by establishing new ministries and stewardship opportunities additional to and apart from the general operation of the congregation. That is still the purpose of both the Trust Fund and the Endowment Fund, as stated in the current Bylaws (amended in 2014). As the principal of the two Funds has grown, the amount of income available for use has also grown. Some of that income is restricted to a specific use, but a large amount is unrestricted and can be used in a variety of ways, depending on what needs are identified.

During 2020, we have experienced the Covid 19 pandemic, which drastically impacted Trinity with no in person worship services, an expansion of our online presence and numerous other trials. Trinity is still strong, particularly with our Trust Fund. The Trust Fund has enabled us to use money to provide for an internship, maintain our physical setting, and continue the goals of the Church as a whole. However, as the pandemic fluctuates between new highs or desired lows, the needs of Trinity continue strong.

We need to consider the future of Trinity in our giving. Regular contributions to Trinity as well as commitments to fund the Trust are greatly appreciated and will be put to good use.
