My mom loved birds, especially robins. She always was on the look out to see that first sign of spring when winter was wearing out its welcome. When my mom passed away in September of 2013, we placed this poem in her funeral service folder as a tribute to her and her lifelong love of birds.

Are we there yet?

That question has probably been heard from the back seat of any vehicle taking a family on a long trip. I recall one memorable road trip from North Dakota to southern California. As an adult traveler, I didn't ask that question, ex-

cept as a joke. I had a map and could figure out for myself just how much progress we were making. Also, I was enjoying the time alone with my parents. Getting to "there" and visiting my siblings was just a bonus to the time on the road.

I suspect the "there yet" question has been included in many of the prayers lifted up by God's children, especially since we've reached – and passed – the one-year anniversary of dealing with COVID-19. For most of us, getting "there" probably means getting back to normal. But – we would like to know when this will happen. We like specifics -- dates and times that can be written on our calendars or entered into our phones.

My Bible Concordance attaches several interesting adjectives to the word "time": acceptable time; appointed time; proper time; fullness of time.
