How do we grow a closer relationship with Jesus? What is our responsibility as a church in helping people grow in faith? What does a vibrant faith formation process look like within a congregation? We are wrestling with these questions for the sake of growing faithful followers of the risen Christ.

In March Council named a Faith Formations Principles Task Force; a small group of people tasked with naming what they believed should be central to Trinity's work in this area. Below, in no particular order, are the principles they have identified:

- *The home is the best place for faith in Christ to be taught and caught. The church's role is to equip parents and children to engage with each other in faith conversations.
- *Faith is continually growing through the classroom, worship, small groups, music, drama, dance, service and more.
- *Our core beliefs are Christ centered, biblically based and authentically Lutheran.
- *All are welcome. We value and encourage diverse voices of all ages and abilities as we live and learn together in our faith community.
- *Children and youth of all ages have an essential role in our congregation and we create active roles for our children and youth in our church community.

Staff, along with the Family Life Committee, will use these principles as we look at building our Faith Formation Program from birth through High School. In early May we have invited all of our parents of kids in our Confirmation Program to come together and help us shape our program for the future. The Principles above will help guide our work.

Why? Part of our mission statement says that we strive to "...**Equip** people with a vital, living faith." That work begins at birth, in the way we walk with new parents. It continues through the toddler years in the way we equip parents to talk about faith and is shaped by each stage of development. Through our principles you will notice a desire for young people to be active participants in the life of the congregation – which we hope sends a message that this is their church as well.
