"Hot town, summer in the city, back of my neck getting dirty and gritty. Been down, isn't it a pity, doesn't seem to be a shadow in the city. All around, people looking half dead, walking on the sidewalk, hotter than a match head."

The Lovin' Spoonful composed that anthem of summer back in 1966. It was a great tune to listen to on KFYR 550 AM as a teenager! Lately, that tune has been spinning around in my head like an old 45... with such a lack of rain for over a year now and seeing much of North Dakota in extreme drought, I worry about this summer being hot and dry -'hotter than a match head.' The weather is a 'hot' topic right now; the ongoing pandemic and its effects continues to be a 'hot' topic; the mood of our nation and the world anymore seems to be 'hot' all the time. Scripture is full of references regarding hot and cold, some in the context of temperature and others regarding the temperament of people. In North Dakota, we are one of only a handful of states that experience the extremes of cold and hot in temperature, but how about our temperament?

I am intrigued by a section of scripture contained in the book of Revelation, Chapter 3, verses 15-16: "I know your works; you are neither cold nor hot. I wish that you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth." This section from Revelation is the last in a series of letters to the seven churches. Verse 16 contains an intriguing image for me... "because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I am about to spit you out of my mouth." That's quite an image for a church…lukewarm. Among the definitions of lukewarm, we find 'lacking warmth or enthusiasm.'

How would we describe Trinity Lutheran? Our Mission Statement begins with the word "welcome," then builds on that word with "equip," and concludes with the word "send." In our recently compiled results from questions distributed at the annual meeting, a common response to the question "In the future Trinity should..." contained the words to be more welcoming and to be striving to make more connections for involvement. To achieve this goal, we will have to focus on not being 'lukewarm'; we will have to be passionate about the calling we all share as bearers of the gospel of Jesus Christ to those we meet along the way.

The gift of listening...

As people emerge from the restrictions of the pandemic we may find that many of them share one characteristic – the need to talk. Yes, we have kept in touch with family and friends by phone, text, e-mail or even an real letter during the past year, but it's not the same as sharing coffee and conversation with those people at Perkins or at one of the

and conversation with those people at Perkins or at one of the tables in the Trinity Community Center between worship services. When someone shares what is on their mind, what has happened to them, or the decisions they have made or are facing, we tend to spring into "help" mode. What can I say or do to make the situation better for this person? The good news is that you don't have to "help" in those ways. You just have to listen. Sometimes the only thing the speaker needs is to verbalize what has been running through his or her mind.

So, how do you listen, <u>really</u> listen? You focus on your conversation partner and on the information you are receiving, not on what you will say when it's your turn to talk. You acknowledge your partner's feelings and perceptions, and you accept what you hear. You may not agree, but you accept that this is your conversation partner's reality.

Do you know someone who needs your gift of listening today? Can you be the 90% listener while this person does 90% of the talking? Some days that may be the best gift you can give. And tomorrow – someone may give that gift to you!

Why is the Trust Fund important?

What happens if a necessary piece of equipment breaks down and the cost of repair or replacement isn't in the annual budget? In recent years, the Trust Fund allowed for the purchase of some new lighting in the sanctuary, replacement of two outdated electrical panels, and new A/V equipment. The Trust Fund Committee voted to help pay for the Capital Campaign with a generous \$350K pledge to the effort. This money makes it possible for needed infrastructure work to commence quickly as other pledges take time to accumulate. Most recently, the Committee reviewed and approved 9 college scholarships for Trinity youth attending secondary education in 2021-2022. In the history of Trust Fund scholarships, 228.5 have been awarded since 1992 when it began.

Meeting these needs is possible because someone gave a gift or bequest in the past that continues to provide income Trinity can use today and in the future.
