TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH 112th Annual Meeting Minutes

February 28, 2021

The 112th annual meeting of the Trinity Lutheran Church congregation was called to order by Cindi Offerman, President, at 11:35 a.m. in the Sanctuary. Pastor Mark Narum offered the opening litany and prayer.

Cindi noted she had several additional items for the agenda: 1) motion to approve electronic participation; 2) appointment of a parliamentarian; and 3) a maintenance issue, which will have a higher repair cost than the Council is allowed to approve.

Mike Horan moved that Trinity Lutheran allow congregational meetings to be held by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication. To the extent permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically. Second by Beth Campbell and carried by a voice vote.

Cindi noted that Bob Wefald was serving as parliamentarian.

Melissa Lewis moved to approve the agenda as printed in the annual report booklet. Second by Margaret Fiechtner and carried by a voice vote.

<u>Minutes of the 2020 Annual Meeting & Special Congregational Meeting</u>: Cindi asked for approval of the 2020 annual meeting minutes as well as those of a special congregational meeting (pages 4-6 of the annual report). Bob Wefald moved the approval of the minutes for the February 23, 2020 annual meeting and the August 30, 2020 special congregational meeting, which was to vote on whether to purchase and install destratification fans to help sanitize the Sanctuary and Community Center as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Second by Don Peterson and carried by a voice vote.

<u>Year in Review</u>: Cindi presented the Report of the President (pages 12-13). She offered a special thanks to the maintenance staff for all the extra sanitizing and cleaning required this year due to the pandemic.

<u>Board & Committee Reports</u>: Mike Horan moved to approve the Board and Committee Reports (pages 16-22). Second by Sheila Peterson and carried by a voice vote.

<u>*Trust Fund Presentation*</u>: Susan Weiand presented the report of the Trust Fund Committee (page 26). She reported that the Trust Fund started awarding college scholarships to Trinity members in 1992 at \$350 each; today those awards are \$1000-5000, depending on qualifying criteria.

<u>2020 Financial/Audit Reports and the 2021 Budget</u>: Troy Zander reviewed the 2020 financial report (pages 27-44) and the audit report dated February 17, 2021. He presented the proposed 2021 budget (pages 45-47). Dwight Offerman moved the adoption of the 2021 budget, as printed in the annual report. Second by Don Peterson and carried by a voice vote.

Cindi reported on the additional agenda item regarding a maintenance issue. There is a need for the replacement of an air conditioner blower coil that recently failed. Rick Clayburgh moved to authorize the expenditure of approximately \$11,000 for the replacement of the air conditioner coil in Blower Unit 2 in the boiler room. Second by Melissa Lewis and carried by a voice vote.

Nominating Report and Election: Beth Campbell gave the 2021 Nominating Committee report as follows:

Melissa Lewis moved to elect the 2021 slate of nominees as presented by the Nominating Committee. Second by Kirsten McIntyre and carried by a voice vote.

For the next two agenda items, Cindi noted that informational meetings had been held several Sundays and Wednesdays explaining the need for the proposed building renovations as well as on the amended Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions.

Building Renovations: Rocky Gordon moved that Trinity Lutheran proceed with the proposed renovations plan, including:

Year One – total bid cost of \$825,000

Education building window replacements;

Education building northeast door & window replacement, along with necessary structural re pairs;

Replacement of the chiller;

- Replacement of the HVAC air handlers for the Sanctuary, Narthex and the unit in the nursery which services the offices;
- Replacement of all thermostatic controls in the building; and
- Filter pack replacements.

Year Two – estimated cost of \$330,000

Replacement of lighting within the Sanctuary and Narthex;

Replacement of ceiling tiles in the rear of the Sanctuary and in the Narthex;

Replacement of portions of the roofing and gutter repairs; and

Replacement of the Sanctuary projection system.

Year Three – estimated cost of \$130,000

Replacement of lighting fixtures in the Fellowship Hall and quilting room; and Weatherization throughout the building.

and further, that Trinity Lutheran officially move forward with a capital campaign to raise the necessary funds to pay for these projects and that together we, as a congregation, not only give our verbal commitment to these projects, but also our financial commitment;

and that Council be given the authority to borrow those funds necessary to complete the first-year projects, and that Council have the authority to borrow money for Years Two and Three only if the capital campaign cash on hand and outstanding pledges are sufficient to cover any debt incurred;



and that Council, in conjunction with the Property Committee, have the authority to spend up to 2% of the annual project costs for unforeseen issues;

and that Council provide updates at each annual meeting of the congregation on the progress of the renovations, capital campaign and status of any loans.

Second by Don Peterson and carried with a written ballot of 101 yes, 2 no.

<u>Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions</u>: Cindi noted that she, Beth Campbell, Mike Hanson, Jim Lewis, Terry Mertz, Dwight Offerman, and Troy Zander served as the committee that worked to incorporate all three documents into one document, based on a template from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Constitutions are to be reviewed whenever a new pastor is called. Cindi asked for a motion on the amended documents.

Mike Hanson moved that Trinity Lutheran approve the document "Constitution, Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church" as our governing document. Second by Kyle Gebhardt. Discussion.

Dwight Offerman moved to amend by striking the following words from the second sentence of section C5.05, "beyond the" and that the following words be added to section C5.05, "additional to and apart from the" so that the section would read: C5.05 This congregation shall have a Trust Fund that will operate as specified in this congregation's bylaws. The purpose of the Trust Fund is to provide for mission work beyond the additional to and apart from the operational budget of this congregation.

Mike Hanson and Kyle Gebhardt agreed to this amendment to the main motion. Discussion.

Troy Zander moved to amend the following bylaws:

Bylaw 17.01.01 All bylaws must be set forth in this governing document. And by adding,

Bylaw 18.01.01. All continuing resolutions must be set forth in this governing document.

Second by Rick Clayburgh. Mike Hanson and Kyle Gebhardt agreed to this amendment to the main motion. Discussion.

Beth Campbell moved to amend the following sections:

C13.09 in the last sentence, strike the words "this article."

C13.09.02 – Membership

In b. 3) remove "Church" and replace with "Congregation."

- In e. remove "Church" and replace with "Congregation."
- C13.09.03 Committee Duties
 - In b. change "Auditing" to "Audit" and remove "this Church" and replace it with "this Congregation."
 - In c. 1) remove "Church" and replace with "Congregation."
 - In d. remove "Church" and replace with "Congregation."

C13.09.05 – Officers

In d. at the beginning of the sentence there are two "the" – remove the second "the."

Second by Mike Horan. Mike Hanson and Kyle Gebhardt agreed to this amendment to the main motion. Discussion. The motion carried on a written ballot of 101 yes; 3 no.

<u>*Capital Campaign*</u>: Troy Zander reported the precampaign work over the past three months was to assess congregation support of this proposed campaign. Commitments have already been received from the Council and the majority of all committee members. The campaign kick-off will be on March 10^{th} and 14^{th} with commitment cards to be collected on March 24^{th} and 28^{st} .



<u>Future Focus Ministry of Trinity</u>: Pastor Narum asked attendees to work in small groups to answer questions on what makes Trinity, Trinity.

Cindi recognized and thanked the Trinity staff and Council members. She presented Certificates of Appreciation to Mike Hanson, Troy Zander, Ray Hegle and Dean Morast.

Newly-elected President Mike Hanson thanked Cindi for her leadership and presented her with a Certificate of Appreciation.

Bob Wefald moved to adjourn the meeting. Second by Kyle Gebhardt and carried by a voice vote.

Pastor Lee Herberg offered the closing prayer.

Meeting adjourned at 12:45 p.m.

The Lord wants us to serve him by serving others. Here is a couple examples of how Trinity is reaching out to others: The Loaves & Fishes ministry that provides those who need food is available on site; We financially support Ministry on the Margins and in 2021 we started a Block Party to get to know and support our neighbors.



We continue to support Missouri Slope in various ways. The one that stands out is our Christmas offering that will be used to support a stained-glass window in the new Chapel.

Looking forward, we will call an associate Pastor this year. A call committee has been selected and brought forward to the annual meeting. A new mission statement will be presented at the meeting as well.

2021 Trust Fund Annual Report

2021 was a very challenging year for all walks of life. The Covid pandemic and other significant events shaped our lives in ever winding turns and changes. Through it all, the Trust Fund managed to survive and is still well intact. During the year, the Committee was able to grant a number of requests for funding. The biggest allocation was a \$350,000 grant for the Capital Campaign, which will be accessed as needed to keep renovations and improvements of the Campaign on track. Keep in mind; the allocations allotted by the Committee are from the interest earnings and not from the base amounts.

Among these requests were: scholarships, additional audio/video equipment, tree removal, upgrade security cameras, an office stand alone AC unit during construction, a block party, boulevard signage (during services), a new door for the main office, annual management fees, intern salary assistance and camperships. All told, there was \$10,100 awarded to scholarship applicants (\$1,500 for seminary), with another \$30,292 for other grants, and \$6,265 in administrative fees. The Capital Campaign grant is not included in these numbers as it will be spent as needed, which extended into 2022. It was first accessed in November 2021, after the liquid donations were expended.

The Trust Fund was established and exists to assist Trinity with its goals and ministry. While it can't be utilized in the budgetary process, it can assist with unexpected expenses such as: excessive snow removal, unforeseen building maintenance issues, or other expenses not anticipated. As you can see from the financial report, the Trust Fund is doing well and should continue to do so with prudent guidance.

After the 2021 annual meeting of the congregation, the Committee welcomed new member, Todd Lang, who will be serving a 5 year term on the Committee. At the present time, the Committee members are Susan Weiand, Susan Ronning, Dan Welsh, Todd Lang, and Dwight Offerman. Each year, one Committee representative is elected to serve a 5 year term.

Trinity Property Committee

2021 Annual Summary

The Property Committee of Trinity Lutheran Church meets monthly the last Tuesday of the month @ 4:00 p.m. This meeting format allows for the committee minutes to be completed and emailed before the Executive Committee of council meets the second Thursday of each month.

The Property Committee exists to care for and maintain the church property to provide a safe, clean, and attractive environment. Members of the 2021 committee were Rocky Gordon, Ken Evenson, Dan Klinger, Tim Spilman, Don Peterson, Bev Cross (council liaison), Financial Director Julie Schaffner and Facility Manager Loren Dally. After the resignations of Rocky Gordon and Don Peterson over the course of the year, we currently have 2 unfilled positions. Ken Evenson is completing his term on the Property Committee.



This past year has been a busy one in terms of monitoring the progress of the renovations approved by the congregation at the Annual Meeting on February 28th. The replacement of the HVAC system for the sanctuary and narthex, windows located in the Education Wing, NE entrance door of the Education Wing and thermostatic controls for the entire facility have been largely completed with only the completion of the thermostatic controls, chiller electrical and coolant fill and test, and the commissioning of the system still to be finished. The project continued to move forward despite COVID related delays in the arrival of key components that require chips and printed circuit boards.

Core Facility Solutions has done a phenomenal job stepping in to take care of the 'hiccups' that arise when replacing equipment while still trying to maintain a level of comfort in the facility in terms of heating and cooling. City Air Mechanical, Straightway Construction and Frontier Electric have all been great to work with – very professional and have gone above and beyond to accommodate the church's schedule of events and groups.

It has been very beneficial for Trinity Lutheran that Core Facilities does not add additional costs to their contract with us for unforeseen issues that pop up over the course of our renovation projects. There were several additional items that needed to be rectified as the project moved forward this year and Core absorbed all of the costs associated with same.

Over the course of the year, we have had an increase in vandalism on church property, notably around the area of the Peace Chapel. The garage was broken into as well and so we have added additional cameras to cover more of the exterior of the church...parking lots and grassy areas. We are changing the main office door to a 'dutch-door' style that will enable office staff to have a more protective environment once we have reopened the church to the public during the day.

Over the course of the year, other areas of concern have been lifted up within the context of our existing facility. The executive committee of the church council, together with representatives from several committees conducted a thorough 'walk-through' of the entire facility. The 1930 building has been undergoing an increase in foundation issues which have manifested themselves in noticeable shifting of the support structure resulting in more cracking on wall surfaces as well as areas that are showing chronic water leaking from the roof to the basement. Additionally, we have found that for the entire building we have only 2 horns that warn of a fire...the top floor of the Education Unit, the entire basement, the Sanctuary, and most of the offices would not hear any fire warning notification. The structural issues as well as our lack of fire notification are currently being assessed and the costs associated with these discoveries have not been reflected in our current capital campaign.

The large tree on the east side of the church property near the 4th St. entrance was removed this past fall. The tree was structurally weakened and posed a hazard to the building should it fall in a storm. The water fountain feature near that tree is also becoming more difficult to maintain and the pump and associated wiring are failing. We are looking at options for this area to still have a focal feature is will not require as much maintenance by staff as well as looking at options for providing shade around the Peace Chapel for worship services and other gatherings.

At the annual meeting, recommendations will be brought forward to the congregation for consideration for the next phase of the renovations presented to the congregation at last years annual meeting. Currently we are looking at how to reprioritize that approximately \$200,000 that has been committed to furthering our renovations after the completion of phase 1 which totaled \$825,000.

Pastor Mark's Report

It has been said that the only constant is change. 2021 serves as a perfect example of that phrase although I would lay beside it that the Gospel is unchanging – God's love through Christ for the entire creation.

COVID caused us to think about all we do in ministry.

- Continued our Confirmation Instruction with an in-person or an on-line option. At the end of the year invited conversation with parents, students and Family Life Committee about how to reshape our program. As fall program began we shifted to inperson only.
- During Lent we worshipped at noon and in the evening providing a soup and sandwich meal before each worship.
- We added a sunrise worship option on Easter Morning.
- Began using the "old altar area" at the foot of the steps to the Community Center as a place to display artistic expressions of the seasons.

Even though we were living in the midst of a pandemic we thought about getting to know our neighbors better, creating outreach opportunities and working to build internal relationships.

- We hosted a block party in June, inviting our neighbors to come for food, worship and a chance to meet some of the neighbors.
- We continued our summer worship pattern of Peace Chapel worship on Wednesday evening and Sundays a public witness of who and whose we are.
- We continue to make our space available to 3 AA groups, Just for Kix Dance, The Banquet and a Tai Chi group.

The Culture of Generosity continues to flourish at Trinity. You can get a good look at the financials in this booklet but here are some highlights.

- The 10 year average for General Fund Offering is \$586,800. In 2021 the General Fund Offering was \$618,600. Well done Generous People!
- Through our "Loaves and Fishes" kiosk we provide food for the hungry. At least 3,120 bags of food were given away. Generous people from this congregation provided funds to buy food or you donated food items and you showed up to pack the bags.
- Generous members of the congregation contributed \$328,247 toward the capital campaign.
- Trinity has a tradition of special offerings at Easter and Christmas. Your Generosity meant that \$2,635 was raised for Designer Genes through the Easter Offering. Another \$5,305 was given toward stained glass windows for the chapel at Missouri Slope.

Where do we go from here? I believe our focus needs to continue to be on Prayer, Bible Study and Invitation. Worship is the central act for faithful people. We are sent from the worshipping community to live and serve our neighbor.

- Prayer grounds us in our faith. It is our opportunity to seek God's grace. I also invite all of us to pray for Trinity that our leadership would be able to discern the Spirit's leading and that we would have the boldness to follow.
- Bible Study allows us to grow deeper in our knowledge and love of God revealed to us through the Son. I encourage you to join one of the many Connect Groups. This is a great way to get to know other members, find connections within the congregation and wrestle with God's Word.
- Invite there are always new people moving to our community. Be open about what you believe God is up to through ministry at Trinity. Invite people to come and see.

I am thankful for Christ centered ministry which is happening through this congregation. The council leadership here is healthy, committed, willing to think deep and ask good questions all the while trying to discern what is the most faithful path forward. Not all congregations are blessed with this kind of leadership.

The world continues to change around us. Together – let us keep our eyes open seeking God's guidance. Blessings,

We are blessed at CCM by the many people who pray for us, participate in, and support our ministries. We are proud and humbled to provide a ministry to all ages that helps each person *"Live out their Lives of Faith!"*. Thank you as a constituent congregation for your support in our success!

CCM, during the year 2021, even though we were continued to be challenged by the pandemic, has had a profound influence in the lives of children, youth, young adults, and adults who were touched by our ministry. It was refreshing for us and the school. The kids had a great time! We continue to work with other local school districts in the hope that they too will join us for outdoor education at CCM.

We were excited to celebrate with the annual Prairie Lake Festival this summer. We held the auction both virtually and in person. Overall, it was a success, but it did have some learning experiences being online. The committee has met and will be planning for an even more successful fundraiser in June. Mark your calendars now for Saturday, June 18th at CCM.

Due to a COVID outbreak within our summer staff, we did have to cancel the last week of camp. We had estimated that was a \$20,000 loss in our budget. But, thankfully, due to generous donors who responded to a summer appeal, we were able to raise over \$19,000 to supplement that loss. Thank you!

Last December, we had to release from employment one of our program managers due to COVID. However, we are overjoyed to welcome Samuel Wolf to our staff starting in January. Sam has been on our summer staff for many summers and is an alumni camper.

Please continue to keep us in your prayers as we navigate this "new" normal in outdoor ministry. Despite the continued challenges of COVID, we are proud of how many people "Live out their Lives of Faith", by being a part of our ministry as donors, ministry participants like yourselves and prayer partners!

Missouri Slope Annual Report

The last year has been anything but normal for all of us at Missouri Slope. Healthcare is a busy industry even before you add a major building project and a global pandemic. Thankfully, we have a strong group of employees, leadership team members, and board of directors who are dedicated to the organization and will do what it takes to assure the mission of Missouri Slope continues in our community. We have been blessed by the various federal relief dollars which are necessary to pay for the additional costs we have seen with labor, supplies, and everything else required to provide high quality care to our residents and tenants.

Our fiscal year ended with many new milestones in terms of revenues, expenses, occupancy, and number of employees. Our occupancy dropped dramatically as the pandemic took hold and we did all we could to respond. The Skilled Nursing Facility on Hillview Avenue reported a year end occupancy of 66% and the Assisted Living Facility reported 85%. A portion of our building was reserved for COVID+ individuals who required special isolation protocols. I am incredibly thankful for and amazed by our team members who have bonded together to find a way to overcome challenges. Our balance sheet grew dramatically the past year due to the new Washington Campus as an asset, and the corresponding debt to finance the project. Revenues and expenses totaled \$28,073,798 and \$28,675,896. Total employees at the end of the fiscal year were 426.

Our annual corporate meeting was well attended by all our member church delegates. We are thankful to be a social ministry of our nine local ELCA churches: Faith, First Lutheran of Bismarck, First Lutheran of Mandan, Good Shepherd, House of Prayer, Lord of Life, Lutheran Church of the Cross, Trinity, and Sunne. Our ministry and mission has thrived because of the support of our members the past 59 years and we are looking forward to the growth and opportunities being added with our new campus. The current projects and plans in motion will assure Missouri Slope will meet the needs of our community for the next 59 years!

Great challenges exist and will continue for all of us as we hope for the end of the pandemic. Every day, we pray for people with the hearts and minds of caregivers to join us in our mission and service to the community. Missouri Slope is a major employer and economic driver for our region. We continue having great opportunities for people to join our team as we complete our transition to the new Washington Campus and beyond. Missouri Slope Update

Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church was instrumental in the formation of Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center, Inc., a North Dakota non-profit corporation on March 13, 1962. It is a 501(c)(3) tax entity. Our late Pastor John Nicolai was the registered agent. Now it is known as Missouri Slope, a ministry of the Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center. Trinity is one of nine area ELCA churches who own Missouri Slope. We elect delegates who meet annually to elect members of the board of directors, who in turn hire the President/CEO who is responsible to the board of directors.



Missouri Slope has built a new skilled nursing care facility on North Washington Street. It has 192 single occupancy rooms. Every resident now enjoys the privacy of single rooms, advanced technology in nursing and personal care, all in a facility designed to enhance their long-term care, as well as short term rehabilitation transitional care. Residents are being transferred from the Hillview Campus to the new Washington Street campus.

One of the central features of this new skilled nursing facility is a chapel. Trinity, as one of the nine ELCA member churches, is being asked by the Missouri Slope Foundation board to participate in a \$500,000 Chapel Challenge. While some of these churches are smaller than others, all have the ability and dedicated parishioners to help meet this challenge over the next 3 years. One idea some of these churches have is the use of a church challenge in which each congregation sets a goal with possible seed money and asks for matching donations over the next 3 years. Trinity could use this idea to meet this challenge. The chapel is a vital part of Missouri Slope, and we as Lutherans understand the importance of a chapel to minister to the spiritual care of the residents.

If you missed the tour of Missouri Slope when Trinity had its turn, we can still arrange a tour for you. You will be impressed with this state-of-the-art skilled nursing care facility.
