Note from the Pastor

"We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose." -Romans 8:28

This past Thursday, the Executive Committee of the Church Council had their monthly meeting to prep for this week's Council meeting. They were given an update on the work to create and correct financial reports. They heard an update on what is happening in the legal process (not much). In the end one of the members, I honestly don't remember who, gave us a wise reminder – we can't dwell on the negative here because we really aren't victims.



Those words made me stop and think. There are some people who are victims – I won't take time to name, but as a congregation we really aren't. The loss of checks has cost some members money – cancelling a check isn't cheap these days. We will be out some cash – we are not sure how much but it is probably in the hundreds of dollars. It has cost staff, council and members time as we have all been tracking finances. In the end we can walk away from this painful situation wiser for it.

In the 8th Chapter of Romans, Paul is writing about how God works to bring about salvation. How God is with humans even in the midst of suffering. For me – and I will only claim it for myself – our Executive Committee conversation has pushed me to think about what we have learned and how Trinity will function better in the future.

For years we have done background checks when a new staff person is hired, we will continue that process but we have learned to add a step or two. About two years ago, in conjunction with the Audit Committee and the Council, we enacted new procedures for handling offering. Those procedures protected us in this process but we have added more pieces to our procedures. I have come away with a new thought or two about our hiring process. In my time with Trinity, all hiring for central positions has happened with an interview team which includes at least one staff member and several congregational members (often at least one person from council), we will review that process.

Once again, I have realized how special a place Trinity Lutheran is. A council and Executive Committee which acted quickly and have been deeply involved. A congregation who received the news of our situation with shock but strong support for leadership and staff. (*I am blown away by the words of affirmation council members and staff have received from our congregational members – you need to know how important that has been.*) A staff who, even though we were in the midst of the holidays were able to lead faith-filled worship services while at the same time spending endless hours helping to figure out Trinity's finances. In the midst of all of it, Christ-centered ministry continued and continues because that is what is most important. We are called at all times to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Blessings All. God does indeed work to bring good even in difficult times. Pastor Mark

Forward, backward, or stalled?

How do you react when you are hit with a "tough time"?

You have choices:

- You can grieve what you've lost a relationship, a position or standing in the community, financial security, etc., and wish you could get it back.
- You can look at all the possible challenges that lie ahead and find yourself spending too much time in the "hamster wheel" of continually worrying about the "what ifs".
- You can get stuck in the "snowbank" of not doing anything.

All of these are normal reactions at the beginning of a tough time, and none of them is a long-term solution.

In an interview I heard recently, singer Amy Grant discussed challenges she faced during her recovery from a serious bicycle accident. She stated that one of the most helpful activities for her was learning to focus on the "right now", and especially to acknowledge any positive experiences in the day, no matter how small. Sometimes she really had to look for the positives, but those little rays of sunshine helped her to believe that things could get better, and she would eventually be able to move forward.

As we travel the road of life, we are likely to encounter obstacles of one sort or another – road construction that reduces forward speed or even requires a detour in our life plans; a missed turn-off that adds extra miles to the trip or extra time to reach a life goal, drowsiness that calls for a rest stop or coffee break as soon as possible or a need to pause and re-think/re-write life goals. Setting up permanent residence at a highway rest stop is a no-no and doesn't get you any closer to your

destination. Wishing for the past or fearing the future won't change anything either. What will you do to re-think and re-set the direction of your life?

No one can make the decisions for you, but sometimes it's helpful to talk your feelings and ideas out with someone who is a good listener, accepts what you are saying, and perhaps asks a question or two that will help you see your situation from another angle. Do you know someone like that? Or can you be that person for someone else?

There is a song that goes back more than a few years and includes the line *"I beg your pardon. I never promised you a rose garden."* Life is like that, but even on the gloomiest days there can be a glimmer of sunshine. Can you find that glimmer on your dark days?




