Count Your Blessings

Trinity Lutheran Church invites us all to Count Your Blessings during the Fall Stewardship drive this October focusing on the hymn of the same name, and Bible passages from Romans 8:31-35, 37-38 and 2nd Kings 4:1-7

Johnson Oatman, Jr. wrote *Count Your Blessings* in 1897 and was a Methodist Episcopal minister who wrote over 5,000 songs in his lifetime.



- "When upon life's billows you are tempest tossed." (Pounded or hit repeatedly by storms or adversities.)
- "Are you ever burdened with a load of care?" (A lot of responsibility, worry or emotional concerns.)
- "Does the cross seem heavy you are called to bear." (An unpleasant or painful situation or person that you must accept and deal with although difficult.)

It is an excellent reminder that when we are pounded by storms, adversities, worries or sadness, God assures us with promises in his Word. And, while harder to see, there are still many blessings worth counting in those uncertain moments throughout our lives.

Romans 8:31-35, 37-38

31 What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? 32 He who did not withhold his own Son but gave him up for all of us, how will he not with him also give us everything else? 33 Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. 34 Who is to condemn? It is Christ who died, or rather, who was raised, who is also at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us. 35 Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will affliction or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or peril or sword?

37 No, in all these things we are more than victorious through him who loved us. 38 For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, 39 nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

What a blessing!

The chorus of Count Your Blessings tells us how to find comfort in those uncertain times ...

Chorus: Count your blessings, name them one by one.

Count your blessings and see what God has done.

There have been times when I didn't recognize or understand the blessings along the way. Only later did I see they were part of the something greater as in the widow's story shared in 2 Kings.

2 Kings 4:1-7

¹ The wife of a man from the company of the prophets cried out to Elisha, "Your servant my husband is dead, and you know that he revered the Lord. But now his creditor is coming to take my two boys as his



slaves.

- ² Elisha replied to her, "How can I help you? Tell me, what do you have in your house?" "Your servant has nothing there at all," she said, "except a small jar of olive oil."
- ³ Elisha said, "Go around and ask all your neighbors for empty jars. Don't ask for just a few. ⁴ Then go inside and shut the door behind you and your sons. Pour oil into all the jars, and as each is filled, put it to one side."
- ⁵ She left him and shut the door behind her and her sons. They brought the jars to her, and she kept pouring. ⁶ When all the jars were full, she said to her son, "Bring me another one." But he replied, "There is not a jar left." Then the oil stopped flowing.
- ⁷ She went and told the man of God, and he said, "Go, sell the oil and pay your debts. You and your sons can live on what is left."

This story reminds us that like the individuals in the story, God had blessed each of us with gifts so we can help others grow, just like the widow. The husband shared his gift of reverence for the Lord; the prophet his gift of wisdom; and the neighbors their gift of possessions. In turn, each had shared their blessings and created a brighter path.

Thanks be to God for the blessing of his son, Jesus Christ. May we truly county our blessings during this time of stewardship and honor God by sharing what he has first given us – ourselves, our time, our talents, and our possessions. 


United Way Backpack Event

A carefully assembled group of 5 volunteers spent the better part of 2 days this week replacing all the burnt-out bulbs for the altar lighting, updating the fan horns, and switching out lights in the community center.






Re-Entry Meal & Support

invite all the singers in our community to join us this November for rehearsals and everyone else to attend the performance on November 30th! Click on the image to enlarge.


Lend a Hand Ministry


