Stephen Ministry

It won't change anything...

Grieving a loss has upended your life, and someone suggests that you look for help – a professional (such as a counselor or pastor), a lay person who has been trained to listen and give support (such as a Stephen Minister), or a support group that focuses on the challenges of dealing with grief (such as Trinity's Grief Support Group).

Sometimes people resist these suggestions because the event that caused the loss and grief can't be changed. That's true. We can't turn back the clock and keep the loss from happening. What support can do, however, is help you navigate your way through your grief and begin to forge a path between "the life that was" and "the life that will be."

What might a support group do for you?

- Help you see that you are not alone in your grief. Everyone in the group has experienced loss
 that caused grief. That's why they are in the group. Their grief may not look exactly like yours,
 and their ways of coping with grief may be different from yours, but they have been (and
 maybe still are) in the grief pit that you are experiencing. This common bond can be
 comforting.
- Give you an opportunity to describe your feelings out loud in a confidential environment and have the other group members accept what you have said (without attaching "good" or "bad" to those feelings). This can lift a little of the weight you are carrying. (Haven't you sometimes said, "I'm glad I got that off my chest"?)
- Affirm that what you are feeling is a normal response to what has happened. So often we
 believe that a Christian shouldn't have negative feelings (anger, questioning) about his/her
 relationship with God, even in times of loss. (If being angry with or questioning God is bad,
 why do so many of the Psalms raise questions about God's presence or purpose during times
 of trial?)
- Help you see a way forward. Support groups are not about giving "you should do..." advice, but sometimes another participant will mention something they found helpful, and that may give you an idea for your next step.

As Christians we are meant to be a community of believers, to encourage, support, and give comfort to each other, and to rejoice in each other's growth in faith. Despite all the old John Wayne movies, we aren't expected to work through life alone. Some type of support system can strengthen us and help each of us grow in faith throughout life. What kind of community can help you negotiate your way through the joys and challenges of life?

If you are carrying grief – either old or new – and wonder if a grief support group might be helpful to you, join us in Trinity's Conference Room at 10:00 a.m. on the first Saturday of every month.


